Daniel Peterson was placed on the Pension Roll in 1819 under the Act of 1818, having served the full duration of the War.

Personally appeared in open Court
Daniel Peterson and made oath that he
was a Regular Soldier in the service of
the United States during the Revolution
any war and was first enlisted at
Lisle in the State of Pennsylvania by Capt
Wm Rippee who belonged to the 7th Regiment
Pennsylvania Troops commanded by Colonel
Wm Butler about the year 1795 and
went to Canada to reinforce General
Montgomery and was on that Cam-
paign in what was called the battle
of the three Rivers and after his return
from that Campaign immediately
re-enlisted under Captain Tutor of
the 4th Regiment of Pennsylvania
Troops Genl Waynes division and
remained in that Regiment and remain-
ed in that Regiment until the close
of the war. This deponent states that
that he was in the battles of Mounioth
Brandevine German Town Poole Stony
Point a Campaign against the In-
dians to Sciota and at the taking of
Carnwallis at Little York and
sometime there after was discharged
at Philadelphia by Colo Fishburn which
discharge by length of time and this

Applicant not knowing the same would
ever be of any service to him has been
lost and is now not in his power to
be produced He states that he has been
a citizen of the United States ever since
before the Revolution and has lived
in the state of Tennessee ^{and in June County} for upwards
of twenty years and is now very
poor and about 70th years of age
and very feeble and stands in much
need of the liberal aid of his Govern-
ment He states that he was in the
service of the United States about
seven years during the Revolution
any war He states that he does not
know of any person in this country
who has any personal knowledge
of his serving in ^{the} service of his country
at the time he has stated or by whom
he can prove the same or he would
produce the same

State of Tennessee } On the 25 day of October 1820 personally
Greene County } appeared in Open Court, being a Court
of Record with Jurisdiction unlimited in point of amount,
keeping a Record of their proceedings, also having power of
Fine and imprisonment for the County and State aforesaid
Daniel Peterson aged about seventy years who being first duly
sworn, according to law, doth on his Oath, make the following
Declaration, in order to obtain the provision made by the acts
of Congress of the 18th March 1818 and the 1st May 1820.
That he the said Daniel Peterson enlisted for the Term of
One year, some time before the Battle at the three Rivers in
upper Kennedy under Captain William Ripley, under Colonel
Cross in the Seventh Pennsylvania Regiment, of Infantry,
and was Discharged at the end of the year in Carlisle in
Pennsylvania, then Enlisted during the war in Captain Campbell
Company under Colonel Butler in the 4th Pennsylvania Reg-
-iment and continued to serve in the said Corps until the End
of the war when he was Discharged in Philadelphia, that he
was in the battles of the three Rivers in upper Kennedy at the
White Plains Germantown Brandywine &c at the Siege of
Little York taking Lord Corn Wallis, and that he has no
other evidence now in his power of his said services other
than his Own Oath, and in pursuance of the act of the
1st May 1820 I do solemnly swear that I was a Resident

Citizen of the United States on the 18th day of March 1818
 and that, I have not since that, time by gift sale or
 in any manner disposed of my property or any part thereof
 with intent thereby so to diminish it as to bring myself within
 the provisions of an act of Congress entitled an act to provide
 for certain persons engaged in the land and Naval service
 of the United States in the Revolutionary war passed on the
 18th day of March 1818. and that I have not nor has any person
 in trust for me any property or securities contracts or debts due to
 me nor have I any income Other than what is contained in
 the schedule hereto annexed and by me subscribed.

Greeting.

Know Ye, that in consideration of an entry made in the Entry Taker's Office of Greene County, of No. 254 dated the 25th day of June 1824 at the rate of TWELVE AND A HALF CENTS PER ACRE by Daniel Peterson

there is GRANTED by the said State of Tennessee unto the said Daniel Peterson and his heirs, a certain TRACT OR PARCEL OF LAND containing thirty

acres, lying in the County aforesaid, in the Charming branch adjoining the lands of John Wright, W. Bartley, Peter and Hannah, including his improvement beginning at a post oak, Wright's corner, thence South by the first run, sixty seven poles, a post oak, Bartley's corner, thence north sixty eight poles to a black oak, Hannah's corner, thence East sixty poles to a small black oak, Hannah's corner, north twenty poles to a stake, near Peter's line, thence East sixty six poles to a black oak, thence a direct line to the beginning

Witness my hand this 7th day of August 1824

Daniel Peterson is not found in the 1830 or 1840 Census of Greene County. He is, however, shown in the 1835 Pension Roster of Greene County, age 83. He may have resided in another household of a different surname.
