D. A. R. records show Daniel Carter was a Soldier in North Carolina: Born c. 1745; Died June 26, 1829. He was married three times. His first wife's name is not identified. The second wife was Anne Jones, and his third wife - and widow- was Sarah Weems. No Pension Records are identified, indicating both he and his widow were deceased prior to the passing of the Pension Acts. Daniel Carter's Will was signed on June 27, 1829 and probated on July 27, 1829.

WILL OF DANIEL CARTER

Daniel Carter dec'd.

Monday 27th July 1829. The execution of the Last Will and Testament of Daniel Carter dec'd, was duly proven by the oaths of Isaac M. Waite and Abraham Weems subscribing Witnesses present and ordered to be recorded and is as follows "In the name of God Amen. In the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty nine I make this to be my last Will and Testament and for this do revoke all Will that hath heretofore been made

And for this to be my last Will and testament. Being weak in body but in sound mind and perfect memory. After my just debts and any funeral charges are paid then I do will and bequeath the all my worldly goods that God hath bestowed on me as follows. First I will to Sarah Keeter my beloved Wife two Cows and Calves one sow and four burrows year olds just. One mass Cabb sold on the 17th of April 1825, one bed and bedstead with its furniture and one large Kettle and bails one Table and four chairs one set of Coffee Cups and saucers, and all the stuff that she brought here with her and one Bureau, One set of knives and forks three whisks two Patent two dishes and six plates, one set of dog irons, one looking glass and glass tumbler one success and one backer, one smoothing iron, Spools and porping of bawes and two bails spun Cotton, six pound block, four hoes and shikent, one hoe, one pair of iron side lines and one pair Lumb also two years and two large Sows also one third one third of all the produce raised in my plantation this year which is 1829 also all my bacon and corn in the Lumb for her use and the stock, also all my geese, Turn over, also the two colored children daughters of Abner who was emancipated by John Keeter died is not to be sold but to remain in the care of my Executors until they arrive to the age of twenty years then to be put to hire them I emancipated and set at perfect freedom, agreeable to the record now in the office in the town of Greenville Green County and State of Tennessee. And also I will and bequeath unto my two sons Eliah and Ellis Keeter all my land to be equally divided between them. I also will and bequeath unto my three daughters Betty Ketter, Sophia Boyd and Semina Williams all the rest of my personal property debts and all demands that are held by note to be sold by my Executors and to be equally divided as follows Betty Ketter's part to her husband, Semina Williams part to her children and I also will to Henry Ketter my son in law one dollar and Thomas Williams my son in law two dollars. I also appoint Eliah Keeter, James Woods, Ellis Keeter and George Weems my executors to execute my last Will and Testament in testimony whereof I have set my hand and affix my seal this 27th day of June 1829
