RICHARD RANKIN

Richard Rankin is believed to be a son of Thomas Rankin [1724-1810] and brother of John Rankin [1754-1829], Samuel Rankin [1758-1828] and William Rankin [1759-1833]. William Rankin was the only brother to remain in Greene County and the only brother to live sufficiently long to apply for a Pension.

In July 1790 Richard is mentioned as a Captain of a Tax District in the Greene County Court of Common Pleas, page 177. He later moved to Dandridge, Jefferson County, TN.

Richard received a Land Grant from North Carolina. The location is not stated. He received 500 acres "joining John Bradshaws lines". A 'Thomas Ranken' received 150 acres on Dumplin Creek [Jefferson County].

and kitchen furniture is to be at her disfieral. and the Stend I bequeath to my son Thomas Rankin a Horse that was left with him in Virginia.

Stew, & give and be queath to my son Samuel & Rankin one dollar. Stem & give any bequeath to my daughter Sabella Riggs Alexander & Rankin, Andrew & Rankin und also my said son Thomas Rankin one hundred and sixty seven acres of Land lying in Sefferson County and joining the Land of Scha Lockers which is to be devided ashongst them agreeable to a plat of division and eyter one mane marked to his part or lot of Land.

Stem. I give and bequeath to my sow John Rankin one horse valued at sitty dollars at the rate of corn at two shillings ser buchel turn over

The same price and values at the same rates and none the same price and values at the same rates and none of the horses to be pais untill my son Robert A. Rankin comes of age.

Stem, & give and bequeath to my son William & Rankin twenty for acres of Land, adjoining the land of S. William William & Rankin just, his brother sames Rankin,

Hem I give and bequeath to may son vames. Rankin one dellar. Her I give and bequeat to my ground daughter Seaw C. Rankin one feather bed and furniture and bed Stead, one car worth ten dollars, one sprinning wheel and it is to be understood that the said claw is to have this property at the death of her grand mother if she continues to live with her that long or till she the O' deaw should get married. I wish my Maggin, my Smith Techs my cattle not other wise disposed mil sheep and Houge to be sold or so much of them as will pay what debts a owe but if my Executors can pay my dist without selling sais property & wish it to be divided between my wife dean Rankin and my two Sond Hickard D. Rankin and Rebut att. Rankin, and lastly a de constitute and appoint my wife dean Kankin and my son Richard & Rankin Excelitors of this smy last Will and Jestaments bouty neveking all others. In withey wherey I have herewate Richard Nankingeres
