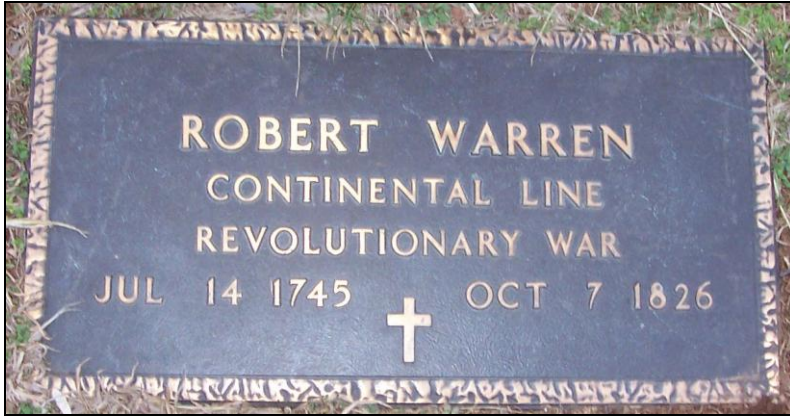


ROBERT G. WARREN
Private, Continental Line Virginia



June 12th, 1776: Ordered that a warrant issue to John Pendleton for use of Robert Warren, for three pounds, nineteen shillings, and six pence, for provisions furnished Captain Stephens and Captain Hayes, their companies.

June 27th, 1776: A warrant to Robert Warren for 2.9.6 for removing cannon from New Kent Court House to Cumberland Town.

Robert G. Warren was born in Charles County, Maryland. At the time of the Revolutionary War, he resided in Virginia [Sevier Family History]. Robert's first wife was Permelia Love; his second wife was Mary Law. By 1798 Robert was living in the western part of today's Greene County, Tennessee, where he was taxed on 320 acres on Little Chucky and 200 acres on Potters Creek. The area known as Warrensburg was named for him. By 1809, he had moved to Blount County. The Family Graveyard was destroyed when the dam was built by T.V.A. for flood control of the Tennessee River. The old Graveyard is now submerged under Ft. Loudon Lake. The remains of Family members were removed to the Louisville Community Cemetery.

WILL OF ROBERT G. WARREN

In the name of God, I, Robert Warren of Blount County, do hereby declare of sound mind and memory, and being of legal age, and calling to mind the mortality of my body, and knowing that it is once appointed for all men to die, do hereby make and declare this my last will and testament that is to say principally and first of all I give, and recommend my soul into the hands of Almighty God, that gave it, and my body I recommend to the earth, to be buried in a decent Christian burial, at the discretion of my executors, nothing doubting but at the general resurrection, I shall receive the same again by the mighty power of God, and as touching such worldly estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me in this life, I give devise and dispose of the same in the following manner and form, I first give to my son James L. Warren one hundred Acres of Land in the lower end of my plantation, likewise I give to my son Volney H. Warren, one hundred Acres of Land on the upper end of said plantation.

I desire to be paid off by my executors the ballance of my plantation
 at my death give to my son Joshua W. Warren and my wife worth
 seventy dollars in trade, at my death desire that my negro
 woman Nancy be set free, likewise at my death I desire that
 my four negroes, namely, one girl named Kagg, three boys
 my son with Oaktown and Stanton be equally divided by my
 executors between my three daughters, viz. Maria L. Pitman
 Elizabeth W. Warren and Elizabeth and Nancy is to have each
 of them a horse worth seventy dollars in trade and a saddle
 for each of them out of my estate, I desire to be sold immedi-
 ately after my death and after paying all just debts and
 funeral expenses the remainder to be equally divided between
 my six children, namely, James Warren, Nathy W. Warren
 Maria L. Pitman, Joseph W. Warren, Elizabeth W. Warren
 and Nancy W. Warren, and I likewise give and bequeath to
 my first wife's children, namely, as follows Charles W. War-
 ren, William W. Warren, Martha Canaway, Susannah Warren
 Thomas L. Warren, David A. Warren, Edward W. Warren
 Jane Kitchin, Lydia Kossau, John J. W. Warren, Elizabeth
 H. Kossau, Mary youngest and Robert W. Warren, one
 dollar each to be paid out of my estate by my executors.
 Lastly, I do hereby constitute and appoint my friends
 James Wilson and Samuel George, Executors of this my
 last will and testament to have full power of all sales
 and divisions, nothing all other or former wills or testa-
 ments by me heretofore made, in witness whereof I have
 hereunto set my hand and seal this twenty second day
 of May in the year of our Lord, one thousand eight
 hundred, and twenty six. Robert Warren (Seal)
 Signed sealed and declared

to be the last will and testament of him the said,
 Robert Warren the testator in presence of us
