JOHN RANKINS VILL -

In the neme of God Amen, I John Rankin of the County of Jefferson and State of Tennessee, being much pained in body yet of sound and perfect memory blessed be God for his mercies do this twelfth day of April in the year of our Lord One Thousand and Right Hundred and twenty eight make and publish this my last Will and Testament in the following manner (vis) 1st., I have four children, two girls and two boys, I give unto my daughters jucinda Harriett one feather bed, One sheet and one counterpaine, I further give unto my two daughters all the delf were belonging to me to be equally divided between them I give unto my son Patrick McGuire the tract of land that I now live on which contains 236 acres I give unto my son Thomas the teact of land that lies on Dumpling Creak which L lately purchased from William C. Rankin containing 130 acres I allow my children to have the use of my books until the youngest comes to lawful age, then what remains of them to be equally divided amongst them. As to the Education of my children the girls has as much learning as will do them, if they are careful to improve themsalves at home. I wish my boys to be sufficiently educated As to the bellance of my personal estate I allow my Executors to sell it and collect all my debts and to pay all my debts and to settle my business of every kind. As to the management of the farms if they arerented let it be done in a menner most to the advantage of the ground I give unto the Rev. John McCompbell one flannel quilt if he will accept it, hoping that as long as he and my children live he will not forger to teach them in the ways of Godliness. When all my debts are paid and all necessary deductions made I wish the remainder of my personal Istate to be divided among my children when they arrive to lawful age in the following way, one girl double as much as one boy. I hereby make and ordain Thomas Rankin, William Rankin, Daniel Lyle and Michael McGuire Executors of this my last Will and Testament and set my hand and seal the day and year above written.
