[No man of this surname appears in Captain Joseph Hale's Militia District (West Greene Co.)] No Bounty Land Warrants or Pension identified. It is possible he may be one of the men shown in Captain Gregory Company, Captain Maloney Company, and Captain McAlpin Company, who was transferred to or from Captain Hale Company. In the 1810 Captain William Guinn's District, a Frederick Hale appears with a Robert Gregory [see John Gass in Captain Gregory's Company who lived in Jefferson County].
